# Contributing to purposeful causes.

## Educational

To bring the highly neglected Pardhi tribe into mainstream living, Amanora Yes Foundation adopted the Suryodaya Paradhi Adiwashi Ashram Shala, Khamgaon Dist Buldhana. As of now, it has 800 resident students of which 350 are girls and 450 are boys. It has been equipped with hostels for girls and boys, the school building, kitchen, and two gymnasiums. Coaches from Kidar Sports Academy impart lessons to 250 kids in archery, athletics, chess, kabaddi and kho-kho. The kids regularly win prizes at the Taluka, District and State level competitions. All classes have been equipped with e-learning software and projectors. The students from 5th to 7th standards have educated their parents for using tabs. The school also has an audio-video library to teach kids from 1st to 4th standards, a computer lab of 30 systems and advanced laboratories. For the last 2 years, the 10th standard has achieved a 100% pass result. The students have planted more than 700 trees on the premises. The future plans include development of a solar system, a second floor of 10 classrooms, a compound for girls' hostel, sports auditorium, ground levelling, basketball & volleyball courts and an athletics track.

## Identifying Rural Scholars

Due to lack opportunities, kids staying in rural areas are deprived of the best opportunities to grow. Amanora Yes Foundation has initiated a program to identify students with potential and give them better opportunities of education and overall development. Till date, the Foundation has taken responsibility of the education of 7 girls, spending considerably to ensure the best quality.

## Career guidance & preparation

We also conduct preparatory workshops for students of class 10. At the same time, we conduct grooming workshops for college students, which are at least 50 km. from the city. The idea is to shape their personalities and prepare them for the competitive world, outside the colleges. Improving their soft skills and interaction with people, also helps them prepare better for job interviews, going beyond books. The confidence they gain from this, helps them overcome any fear they have.



## Healthcare

Understanding the problem of rising pollution in Pune, which enhanced the risk of breathing diseases, a campaign called 'Right to Breathe' was launched. Reputed names like Cipla and Lupin participated in this campaign. 8107 people belonging to different professions like rag pickers, cleanliness workers, police, mechanics, conductors & drivers of PMPML buses, construction workers, mechanics, conductors & drivers of ST buses, IT professionals and workforce of government and private organisations benefited from this drive. Medicines were given to 7465 children and women after conducting their HB test. Eye tests were done for 5941 people after which 1340 spectacles were distributed and 250 cataract surgeries were performed. Additionally, 2401 people were vaccinated for Hepatitis. With cancer being a rising menace among women, oral, breast and pregnancy-related cancer tests were conducted for 6014 women. Going ahead, medicines and treatments will be given to construction workers.





## Social

Malin village was severely damaged by cloud burst. Collaborating with the government, we took the responsibility to transform it into a Smart Village. This included assisting the Tahsildar and Talathi to implement online administration, monthly medical camps for people in and around Malin, and skill development of women towards creating cloth bags, blankets and bedding kits. This has resulted in production of 600 blankets, 5000 bags and 300 bedding kits.



## Suryodaya Balgriha

One of our key contributions is towards the Suryoday AIDS Foundation, an organisation that works for vulnerable children living with HIV/AIDS in Pune & Akola. We provide them with psycho-social care, healthcare, nutrition, education, spiritual support, entertainment, etc. to give these children a life of dignity and self worth with love and kindness.

## Environmental

### Organising Sadbhavna Rally

Educating people about conservation and sustenance of water and trees, which received strong participation from students, residents and other people.

### Jalmitra

It is necessary to understand the importance of water and save it. We finalized a process of save-recycle-reuse. We brought together 1700 maids and 300 car washers working at Amanora. Sevavardhini conducted a session on water conservation under Janshakti for Jalshakti.

For the first program, 1800 maids and car washers were present. Their medical tests were conducted. Rotary International was brought on-board to improve literacy among them. Across 5 sessions, 250 Jalmitra were educated. 30 champions and 10 teachers were shortlisted. Trainings were organised for the remaining 1450 Jalmitra, to groom 50 teachers from the group. To increase the participation of women, Jalmitra Mahila Mandal was established, with 1 program conducted every month.

Sevavardhini joined hands with these 50 teachers to educate the maids in housing societies in eastern Pune. The aim is to save 25 lakh litres of water through them. Going further the idea is to make these women and their families financially independent and medically fit.
